INSTRUCTIONS FROM THE DEAN FOR RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

On this Sunday, All Saints' Day 2020, we are offering the option of receiving Holy Communion in both kinds, for the first time since the beginning of the Coronavirus Pandemic. The means of receiving in both kinds (wafer bread and wine) has been carefully considered by the House of Bishops of the Church of Ireland (with a little input over the summer months from our own Dean!). The means of distribution today follows the guidance laid down by the House of Bishops. This is in accordance with best practise as advised by medical experts. Communion bread will be received as individual wafers. Communion wine, which has been consecrated in a single flagon, and then poured into individual cups, will be received from tables at the top of the South or North aisles. This temporary guidance and permission will run until Pentecost Sunday 2021 when it will once again be reviewed.

From today at Belfast Cathedral we offer Holy Communion in both kinds, to be received in the following way:

When guided by the Cathedral Wardens please make your way from your seat to the clergy at the foot of the quire steps. As you make your way, please keep a 2 metre distance from those in front and behind. Please continue to wear your face covering. At the Quire Step, a communion wafer will be placed in your hand. Now please move towards the South or North side aisle. Remove your mask and consume the wafer. Now move to the first table and take an individual cup of communion wine, taking care not to touch any other cup. Move to the side and drink the communion wine from the individual cup. Next place the empty cup on the second table, again making sure not to touch any other cups. Now please replace your face covering and return to your seat via the South or North Aisle.

The members of the Choir will receive separate instructions about receiving communion or a blessing.

We remind you that it remains fully valid for any member of the congregation to receive communion in one kind (wafer bread only) and in so doing to fully participate by faith in receiving the body and blood of Christ.

Almighty God, you have knit together your elect in one communion and fellowship in the mystical body of your Son Christ our Lord: grant us grace so to follow your blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living that we may come to those inexpressible joys that you have prepared for those who truly love you; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

PROCLAIMING AND RECEIVING THE WORD

Please sit for the **EPISTLE READING**: Revelation 7:9-17

I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, 'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing,

'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom

and thanksgiving and honour

and power and might

be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.'

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Then he said to me, 'These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

For this reason they are before the throne of God,

and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.

They will hunger no more, and thirst no more;

the sun will not strike them,

nor any scorching heat;

THE GOSPEL READING: Matthew 5:1-12

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Matthew.



When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

'Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

'Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

'Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

'Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

'Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

'Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.'

Please stand and face east for the NICENE CREED: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. THE TAKING OF THE BREAD AND WINE

Christ our passover has been sacrificed for us **therefore let us celebrate the feast.**



Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise._

Father, almighty and everliving God, at all times and in all places it is right to give you thanks and praise:

In the saints you have given us an example of godly living, that, rejoicing in their fellowship we may run with perseverance the race that is set before us, and with them receive the unfading crown of glory:

Blessed are you, Father, the creator and sustainer of all things; you made us in your own image, male and female you created us; even when we turned away from you, you never ceased to care for us, but in your love and mercy you freed us from the slavery of sin, giving your only begotten Son to become man and suffer death on the cross to redeem us; he made there the one complete and all-sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world: he instituted, and in his holy Gospel commanded us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death until he comes again:

On the night that he was betrayed he took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me. In the same way, after supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks to you, he gave it to them, saying, Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, Father, with this bread and this cup we do as Christ your Son commanded: we remember his passion and death, we celebrate his resurrection and ascension, and we look for the coming of his kingdom.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; and as we eat and drink these holy gifts, grant by the power of the life-giving Spirit that we may be made one in your holy Church and partakers of the body and blood of your Son, that he may dwell in us and we in him:

Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, Almighty Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

THE COMMUNION

If you wish to receive communion, please move to the foot of the Quire steps to receive the communion wafer from the clergy, when directed by the cathedral wardens. Please continue to wear your face covering. When you have received the communion wafer in your hand, please move to the side take off your face covering and consume communion. Next go to the first table to take the individual cup and to consume the wine. Please then set the cup on the second table, replace your face covering and return to your seat via the side aisles. If you wish to receive a blessing only, please cross your arms. Please indicate if you require Gluten Free wafer bread.
