PSALM: 69:1-20

Save me, O God * for the waters are come in, even unto my soul. I stick fast in the deep mire, where no ground is * I am come into deep waters, so that the floods run over me. I am weary of crying; my throat is dry * my sight faileth me for waiting so long upon my God. They that hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of my head * they that are mine enemies, and would destroy me guiltless, are mighty. I paid them the things that I never took *God, thou knowest my simpleness, and my faults are not hid from thee. Let not them that trust in thee. O Lord God of hosts, be ashamed for my cause * let not those that seek thee be confounded through me, O Lord God of Israel. And why? for thy sake have I suffered reproof * shame hath covered my face. I am become a stranger unto my brethren * even an alien unto my mother's children. For the zeal of thine house hath even eaten me * and the rebukes of them that rebuked thee are fallen upon me. I wept, and chastened myself with fasting * and that was turned to my reproof. I put on sackcloth also * and they jested upon me. Hear me, O God, in the multitude of thy mercy * even in the truth of thy salvation. Take me out of the mire, that I sink not * O let me be delivered from them that hate me, and out of the deep waters. Let not the water-flood drown me, neither let the deep swallow me up *and let not the pit shut her mouth upon me. Hear me, O Lord, for thy loving-kindness is comfortable * turn thee unto me according to the multitude of thy mercies. FIRST LESSON: Isaiah 5:1-7 Let me sing for my beloved my love-song concerning his vineyard: My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill. He dug it and cleared it of stones, and planted it with choice vines; he built a watch-tower in the midst of it, and hewed out a wine vat in it; he expected it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard. What more was there to do for my vineyard that I have not done in it? When I expected it to yield grapes, why did it yield wild grapes? And now I will tell you what I will do to my vineyard. I will remove its hedge, and it shall be devoured; I will break down its wall, and it shall be trampled down. I will make it a waste; it shall not be pruned or hoed, and it shall be overgrown with briers and thorns; I will also command the clouds that they rain no rain upon it. For the vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel, and the people of Judah are his pleasant planting; he expected justice, but saw bloodshed; righteousness,

but heard a cry!

MAGNIFICAT:

SECOND LESSON: Mark 12:1-12

Jesus began to speak to the chief priests, the scribes, and the elders in parables. 'A man planted a vineyard, put a fence around it, dug a pit for the wine press, and built a watch-tower; then he leased it to tenants and went to another country. When the season came, he sent a slave to the tenants to collect from them his share of the produce of the vineyard. But they seized him, and beat him, and sent him away empty-handed. And again he sent another slave to them; this one they beat over the head and insulted. Then he sent another, and that one they killed. And so it was with many others; some they beat, and others they killed. He had still one other, a beloved son. Finally he sent him to them, saying, "They will respect my son." But those tenants said to one another, "This is the heir; come, let us kill him, and the inheritance will be ours." So they seized him, killed him, and threw him out of the vineyard. What then will the owner of the vineyard do? He will come and destroy the tenants and give the vineyard to others. Have you not read this scripture:

"The stone that the builders rejected

has become the cornerstone;

this was the Lord's doing,

and it is amazing in our eyes"?"

When they realized that he had told this parable against them, they wanted to arrest him, but they feared the crowd. So they left him and went away.

Lord of our life and God of our salvation, we surround thy throne with thanksgiving for thy mercy to us and to all people, for the blessings of thy providence, and for thine infinite grace. It is meet that at all times we should bless thee, for day by day we live by thy bounty, and thy gifts to us never cease. We magnify thy name for thine unspeakable gift in Jesus Christ thy Son, and for thy purpose of love towards all people which he gave his life to fulfil. More especially, this day, we praise thee for the faithfulness with which he trod the way of thy will, and the grace with which heh endured the contradiction of sinners.
